Since medieval times a thriving bustling market has taken place at St Omer in the Place Foch every Saturday from 8am until early afternoon. The local produce is proudly displayed alongside goods from further afield. A brewery, just beyond the town centre produces the local brew, 'La Bière de St. Omer'. The town's Notre Dame Cathedral is widely recognised as the most beautiful intact vestige of gothic architecture to be found north of Paris. For lunch there is a plentiful choice of cafes and restaurants to suit all tastes to be found surrounding the square and nearby walking streets. For those interested in a bit of retail therapy the town has a good selection of shops. There should also be time to visit Cite Europe on the return journey to Calais to stock up for Christmas.

Have you received a new RED Vehicle Registration Certificate (V5C) for your car/s yet? The DVLA are currently replacing all of the existing BLUE V5Cs following a theft of a number of blank blue V5C forms. Their aim is to reduce the risk to motorists of buying a stolen or cloned vehicle. Although it is unlikely that mistakes will be made by the computerised system, it is advisable to check the new RED V5C to ensure it matches exactly to your existing Blue one, before destroying this as instructed. If you have more than one vehicle it is most likely that the new certificates will arrive at different times. You do not need to worry about this or contact the DVLA as the "roll out" of these replacement registration certificates is expected to be on-going until November 2012.

## MG AUSTRIA 2011 - BY RAY AND JOY REEVES



On September 5<sup>th</sup> 2011 we travelled to France on Eurotunnel. We met two other MG members at the terminal and started our adventure. The journey through Belgium was uneventful although the surface of the roads was not good. We arrived at our hotel in Marche-en-Famenne, an old hotel with very modern facilities. After a drink it was into the pool for a swim then a fabulous dinner with all the other members of the group some of whom had arrived from the north of England and Scotland plus Richard Webb from the MGOC Travel club & Beverley Ambrose from MGOC HQ our guides & organisers for the 12 day holiday.

The next day we left Belgium and were soon in Luxemburg where we filled up with petrol because it was 20 cents per litre cheaper there and continued on into Germany where the roads were much smoother. Our hotel stop that night was in the town of Dahn again a beautiful hotel with excellent facilities so a drink and a swim before dinner. After breakfast we were then off all through Germany almost to the Austrian border to Fussen. Our hotel that night was completely different; a typical Bavarian hotel with painted furniture and huge rooms. We had Adam and Eve painted on our bed head and cherubs on the foot board. Opposite our hotel was a passageway which led to the old pedestrian town with bars and interesting shops, well worth investigating. The next morning we lost Richard, who had other commitments and flew back to England to be replaced by Andrew Melley from the travel club.

Once into Austria and having purchased our vignette we were off to Kitzbühl, our home for the next 6 days. Once again we were not disappointed by the hotel. The rooms were fabulous with all the facilities you could want and a balcony. Here we unpacked, having lived out of a suitcase for the last three nights; then it was off for the customary drink and swim. The pool was an infinity pool with buttons which you pressed to make bubbles, great fun. We decided to give the car a rest for the next two days, there was the Schwarzsee lake just outside the town so a walk round there was good after sitting in the car for three days. The next day we took the gondola up to the top of the Hahnenkamm, a notoriously difficult ski run, and then decided we could walk down to the town. Little did we know how difficult it would be walking downhill all the time. Some 3 hours later we were exhausted and our legs ached so badly. I was never so glad to see a bus stop, but unfortunately we had just missed a bus and the next one was not due for an hour, so a cab was called and we travelled home in luxury.

Back in the car next day, a really sunny hot day so, hoods down, we set off to the Gerloss Pass, camera at the ready and what views there were; I never stopped clicking. We passed the Krimml waterfalls and, further along the road, had stunning views of them. It was one of our group's birthday today and she very kindly supplied champagne before dinner. It was a beautiful evening so we had dinner out on the terrace. Another day and in the car to a village called Rattenberg, which specialised in glass making, with a pedestrian street lined with shops selling glass objects. There was a glass blowing area in one of the shops with demonstrations. Having bought a beautiful vase and flowers, all made of glass and several gifts for home, we walked up to the castle at the top of the hill, which gave beautiful views of the Inn valley. Each evening of our stay in Kitzbühl, all the MG group seemed to arrive back at the hotel by about 4 o'clock ready for a drink and a swim; it became a ritual.

We were all very sad to leave Kitzbühl the next day; we had all enjoyed our stay so much but leave we must and on to Lindau on Lake Constance. The journey was quite spectacular up and down mountains and over two passes; the 'B' loved it and so did we. Our hotel was right on the lake with just a pedestrian area in front; again an excellent hotel but only an outside pool so not so many keen swimmers here. We had two nights in Lindau and the next day several of our group visited the Zeppelin museum in Friedrichshafen, or went on one of the many boat trips on the lake. We chose some retail therapy and a walk around the lake. The next morning we decided the lake would be a good place to have a photo call for the cars. So we were duly lined up at the edge when we noticed there was some oil leaking under our car; immediately the bonnet was up and eight pairs of men's eyes were in there. Steven from Scotland unloaded his car boot and produced a trolley jack and donned his MG overalls and slid under the car with his spanner. A few quick taps and turns and all was repaired – problem averted.

Onwards and upwards to our next stop in Obernai which was just on the German/French border and yes it had a super indoor pool. We had a group table for dinner in a very swish dining room (with wine prices to match) and we were very glad one of our group could speak good French to help us order. So on to our last stop, through the lovely Saint Nabor forest and the Vosges mountains; once again the 'B' performing well and on to Reims. Our hotel this evening was a Best Western and a good typical city hotel. 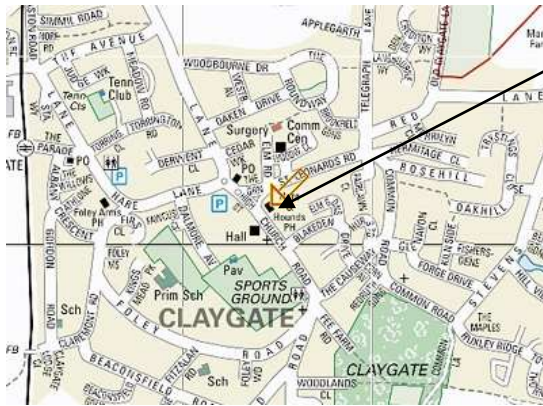

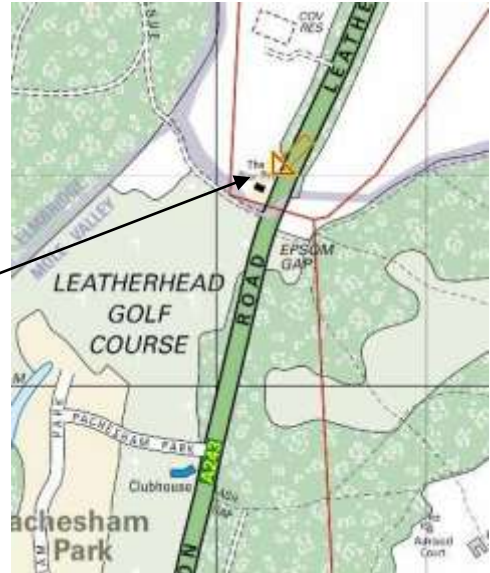
