I mentioned last month that Foggy has given us the goahead and declared that he is happy with the route from Bocketts Farm to the Weald and Downland Museum at Singleton in West Sussex. The route this year has been targeted at about 60 miles. The Run is always claimed to



be through some of the most picturesque countryside in Surrey. Once the route has been set, our practice is then for other members of the Club to also check the Run, and I can report that Malcolm Childs and Eric have now done this. I have to congratulate Foggy, as the route is superb and once again he has done an excellent job. On this basis, the route maps are now going to print. The route passes a garden centre with facilities for a comfort stop if required and there are also plenty of pubs on the way for those wishing to stop for lunch. In the dedicated parking area at Singleton there is plenty of room for a picnic but there is also a snack bar within the museum buildings.

As usual, Ray Reeves and our team of marshals will be there to receive you on arrival. The marshals will be parking the MGs in a dedicated "Event Arena" central to the museum, where all the cars can be admired by other visitors. For those on the Run, do not forget to give in your special entry ticket as you reach the finish line for inclusion in the Prize Draw that may win you store vouchers worth 50 pounds.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved with the planning of this event and especially those of you taking part. I have been very pleased once again with the response that we have had from the many MG enthusiasts that enjoy our SURREY RUN.
