Saturday 24th March – Royal Albert Hall

Epsom MGOC Visit and guided grand tour giving the history of the Royal Albert Hall, Kensington Gore, London SW7 2AP. Meet at 11.15am outside the front of the Hall for tour commencing 11.30am. Tour lasts about an hour. Cost per head £10. Refreshments are available at the venue or in nearby cafes.

Saturday 19th May Visit and Guided Tour of the Langham Brewery

Langham Brewery is an independent craft brewer in Lodsworth, West Sussex GU28 9BU. Meet 1.45pm at venue for Tour commencing 2pm. Tours last 1.5-2 hours. Cost per head £12. There will be the chance to sample, and also purchase, some of the beers. Venue is 'dog friendly'. Soft drinks can be provided for those members who will not be sampling the beers.

Guided Postal Walk and Visit to Postal Museum

Provisional dates are Saturday 9th June or Saturday 16th June with guides John Morgan and Marion Clarke for Epsom MGOC's Guided London Postal Walk and visit to the London Postal Museum and ride on the Mail Train. Cost for London Walk is £7ph and the walk lasts approximately 2 hours. Meet at 10.45am for 11am start - venue to be confirmed. 




