SURREY RUN 2019



I am pleased to say that we now have finalised plans for our **SURREY RUN**, which is taking place on **Sunday 14th July.** We have negotiated the finish point to be the **Rural Life Museum at Tilford**, **near Farnham**. I have mentioned before that this is a favourite of mine and a venue which we have used successfully in previous years. The Rural Life Museum seems to appeal to a wide range of our enthusiasts and following our last visit, the management have always been keen to welcome us back.

This museum of country life was originally assembled by a couple, Henry and Madge Jackson, who moved onto the site in 1948. They came up with the name "Old Kiln" following a dilapidated hop kiln that unfortunately did not survive. There was no electricity in the area until the 1960's but Henry had power using an old generator. When the neighbours heard it start up each evening they knew it was time to light up their oil lamps.

The site covers 10 acres of fields, woodlands and barns comprising a large number of implements and devices marking 150 years of farming. There is also an arboretum with over 100 species of trees. The museum displays farming through the seasons, local hop growing and crafts allied to industrial and country needs. The social history of village life from the 19th century is displayed covering school life, domestic work, period shops and trades. There is 1930's garage, a working iron furnace and wood yard, all run by volunteers. The site also hosts a two-foot narrow gauge Old Kiln light railway and blacksmiths forge.

Henry and Madge opened the doors of their museum to the public in 1973 and it became a charitable trust in 1984. In the Year 2000 they were both nominated as Members of the British Empire in recognition of their work. Henry died in 2004 and left the museum in the care of the Trustees who have continued to improve the displays to this day.


