SURREY RUN 2019



Time is marching on but we still have a couple of months to go before **Sunday 14th July, our SURREY RUN**. Last month I wrote about our finish point the **Rural Life Museum at Tilford near Farnham**. This month I will say something about our link with **Bocketts**, a children's farm that has hosted the start of this event for nearly twenty years. They provide all the vital ingredients that we require, (ie parking, toilets) and for a modest sum, a cooked breakfast if needed. In return, we have always contributed to their own favoured charity, Kids for Kids. As you know one of the objectives of our annual run is to support deserving causes, but this donation is never shown in that respect so I thought I would highlight it in this article.

The organization was started by a lady called Patricia Parker, based in Dorking Surrey, who was traveling in a place called Dafur in the Sudan, an area of extreme poverty ravaged by wars and constant drought. Patricia came across a young boy of nine years old who spent seven hours each day hungry and at risk, walking to collect water for his family. As I have a grandchild of the same age I can imagine how she felt. Although the family was very poor it turned out that the boy's mother had a couple of goats. The water was to keep the goats alive and in turn, the milk they provided gave the only available nourishment to keep her children alive. Patricia was inspired by this and that is how Kids for Kids was started. By providing a range of projects and goat loans, she enabled the villagers to actually help themselves in this remote and inaccessible region of the world where violence is still a daily hazard on the walk to water.

Over the last twenty years, this charity has adopted 92 villages across North Dafur assisting over half a million people. In return for the hospitality that Bocketts Farm has shown us, at their request we have constantly made a direct contribution that they pass on to this charity. Although this is a relatively modest sum, each year I always receive a heartfelt letter of thanks from the founder Patricia Parker for our donations. I feel very humbled at this, and with your help and via Bocketts Farm, I feel that it is another way we support those less fortunate than ourselves. My thanks go to you all.


