PETER BECKETT 1932-2019

It is with much sadness that I received the news, from Carole, that Peter had passed away on Tuesday 14th May in St Helier Hospital, Carshalton. Peter was in hospital on his 87th birthday on 1st May and the family took him in spare ribs and chocolate eclairs, which he enjoyed. It was a year ago that Peter underwent two successful operations to correct two arteries, following a heart attack.

Peter and Carole are long serving members, having joined the Epsom Area MGOC in 1992. They always attended most of the events on the calendar and were always ready to put their name down to help whenever it was needed. They were regulars at the Southern National Events held at the Leatherhead Centre, part of Ray Reeves team that received run entrants at the finishing venues of the Surrey Run and regularly supported the St Raphael's Hospice Fun Day. Their MG's were often on show to the public where we had a club stand and rarely missed a monthly meeting.

Apart from his MG involvement, Peter had more than a passing interest in the Scout movement. Carole was involved in scouting herself and when she and Peter married, she also became involved, which lasted for 57 years.

Peter was one of life's Gentlemen, much respected by fellow members and others who knew him. Unfortunately, Peter's health deteriorated in recent months and he was back in hospital on a number of occasions and always fought back, but he became progressively weaker over time.

Peter was a quiet individual, and had an engaging personality and will be greatly missed by us all and we and the family are the poorer for his passing. We will remember him with much fondness. Rest in peace Peter.

SURREY RUN 2019



I am pleased to say that we now have finalised our route for our **SURREY RUN**, which is taking place on **Sunday 14**th **July 2019**. Starting from **Bocketts Farm Leatherhead**, we will finish at the **Rural Life Museum at Tilford**, **near Farnham**.

This Museum of Country Life was originally assembled by a couple, Henry and Madge Jackson, who moved on to the site in 1948. The site covers 10 acres of fields, woodlands and barns comprising a large number of implements and devices marking 150 years of farming. There is also an arboretum with over 100 species of trees. The museum displays farming through the seasons, local hop growing and crafts allied to industrial and country needs. The social history of village life from the 19th century is displayed covering school life, domestic work, period shops and trades. There is 1930's garage, a working iron furnace and wood yard, all run by volunteers. The site also hosts a two-foot narrow gauge Old Kiln light railway and blacksmiths forge.

Henry and Madge opened the doors of their museum to the public in 1973 and it became a charitable trust in 1984. In the Year 2000 they were both nominated as Members of the British Empire in recognition of their work. Henry died in 2004 and left the museum in the care of the Trustees who have continued to improve the displays to this day


