CORDLE RUN

Sunday 18th August 2019
Sussex Prairie Gardens



On Sunday 18th August, the Cordle Run will take you through Surrey and Sussex lanes on a scenic tour ending up at Sussex Prairie Gardens. This will be a fairly short run of about 40 miles, as we attempt to try and locate a few roads that we haven't used before, keeping as much as possible of the main roads. We will also have our normal 'easy fun quiz' for those who wish to partake, to exercise your brain on the journey.

Surrounded by mature oak trees the eight acre garden consists of a series of interlocking arcs of large planted borders in a naturalistic style. The borders encourage exploration and adventure and visitors are welcome to roam in amongst the mighty plants to further enjoy the experience. The plantings consist of large groupings of each variety, planted in free flowing style, which contrasts leaf forms, stems, stalks flower shapes and textures.

Colours are soft and muted, and complement the natural landscape. The borders serve as a living catalogue of plants used by Paul and Pauline in their garden design business, the plants themselves are the stock plants from which plants are taken into the farm nursery.

Both Paul and Pauline are keen to emphasise the beauty and wonder of perennial planting and to demonstrate the longer season benefits of perennials and grasses in dream combinations.

The borders, planted in the shape of a spiralling nautilus shell were planted in May 2008 with 40 of our friends and family who were totally behind us and supporting us with this amazing project.

Pauline has offered to give our group a short talk about the history and development of the gardens!

There is an adult admission charge of £8 a person, no concessions, although RHS members, with an asterisk on their card, are entitled to free entry. A Gardens World pass also admits 2 for 1. Dogs are welcome on a short lead. There is a Tea rooms and a nursery selling various plants.



Bazaar Indian Summer is at the Gardens while we are there. An event in Marquees selling gorgeous clothes in cottons and vintage sari silk, semi precious designer jewellery, scarves, home furnishings and gifts – all ethically traded from India.

Alex's curry "Dhaba" will be serving delicious authentic curries.

Jo Hall will be giving talks on textiles and Nepal and there will be woodblock printing for kids and adults !

Please note the starting place of the run this year is again at The Pheasant PH on the Reigate Road (A25) at Betchworth. Toilets, coffee and refreshments are available at the pub. We hope you will be able to join us. Cars will be leaving Reigate from 9.30 am onwards.

SECRETARY'S SCRIBBLINGS

This past wet month has gone very quickly indeed and I don't seem to have done very much in respect of Epsom's activities.

I would like to remind everyone that our **Pride of Ownership** competition for the Penny Broughton Memorial Trophy will be held this year at our July monthly meeting on **Thursday 4th July at 7.30 pm**. I do hope that many of you will bring your MGs to this meeting and join in with the spirit of the event. I have reserved the whole of the rear parking area at Sutton United Football Club which is the same area as we used last year.

It is our **Surrey Run** event on **Sunday 14th July 2019**, there are still spaces so that you could make an application or book in on the day if you wish. It will be a 62 mile route starting from Bocketts Farm in Leatherhead and finishing at the Rural Life Centre & Museum at Tilford near Farnham, Surrey – it will be an excellent event and the weather is forecast to be fine.

I understand that spaces for the **South Downs Run** on **Sunday 1st September** are rapidly disappearing and when full, entries on the day will not be accepted. By popular request the route continues to start from Bury Hill car park between 8.30 to 11.00 am and tulip style route instructions will be provided. The entry fee is £25.00 and application forms can be obtained from their website or on-line bookings made at www.wsmgoc.co.uk

I have recently read on the MGB Facebook forum about yet another engine fire on an MGB GT, presumably caused by a perished fuel pipe. I would urge club members who own a fifties, sixties, seventies and eighties classic MG or other classic cars to consider replacing their rubber fuel pipes with an Ethanol resistant type; these are available from Burlen Fuel Systems Limited, www.burlen.co.uk. Ethanol is added to modern fuel and is known to "harden" the rubber pipes causing them to split, resulting in fuel spillage and in some cases creating serious engine fires. I have been asked about the MGF and (Modern) TF, but I understand that the fuel system on these models is resistant to the effects of ethanol, so there is no need to replace the fuel pipes.

The TT mark 7 exhaust fitted to my MGF has quietened down considerably with age. It's now been on the car for 18 months, although I have not undertaken any significant mileages. I have yet to see if the lower noise level makes a difference when cruising on motorways.

I have been unable to find a suitable joke this month but a member kindly gave me a list of quick one liners which were very funny, but I pondered over using them. Do I use a few, all of them, or not at all, so I opted for "not at all" – sorry source, I will use them.
