SURREY RUN 2021

Well, here we are at the beginning of June with just a few weeks to go before our first major event of the year, the 20th anniversary of our **SURREY RUN** due to take place on the **18th JULY** with the finish venue at **LEONARDSLEE LAKES** and **GARDENS** near Horsham in West Sussex.

Due to COVID, the journey since our last Run in 2019 has certainly been a challenge, but fortunately we have continued to promote the event. If all goes well with the Government plans on 21st June, and everyone having been so restricted in the use of their MGs for over a year, we are well positioned for a successful day. As I explained in previous articles, at the point last year when we unfortunately had to postpone the Run, we already had 91 enthusiasts registered to take part. With our event still on the horizon, the recent activity in interest and registrations has been amazing to such an extent that I am now having to consider a cut off in the numbers as we will soon be overwhelmed. So my urgent message to you all is that if you are thinking of taking part and have not yet booked then use the form below and send it in quickly as the last thing in the world I want to do is to turn away our own members.



The next point that I would like to make is that, if the new Indian B1617.2 variant of the virus does not change the Government plans for a significant relaxation in COVID precautions, I still fell that we should all act responsibility. Most of what you will see at Leonardslee is outside but I suggest that you all take a mask as there is a building containing the dolls house and it would be a shame to miss this if there were still a few restrictions. We will be continuing with all precautions including parking, providing surface cleaning material, hand sanitisers and face masks (full face for registration helpers) for all the marshals involved on the day. We are even giving away a free 20th anniversary Epsom Area pen to all participants to be used when signing the indemnity form at the beginning.

The other good news is that I have is that we have a new Official Sponsor for this event. The main dealer RICHMOND MG at Guildford will be in attendance at Leonardslee with a display of their exciting new range of cars including both hybrid and fully electric versions.


