SURREY RUN 2021

Following a number of challenges during the past year, we are now just days away from our major charity fund raising event SURREY RUN 2021 on the 18th July. We have had a very positive response from MG enthusiasts such that, with over 200 cars registered, the event is now fully booked to those outside our own Epsom Club. I did have a forlorn hope that by the 21st June the COVID-19 restrictions would have eased - although my intention has always been to protect everyone in our care, an official easement would have made life simpler. As you are all aware, as a result of the new and dreaded Delta variant, Boris has now announced a delay to the Roadmap plans until the 19th, the very day after our event. I do believe that he has made the correct decision, so we now have to work within the present guidelines. The plans that we have at Leonardslee are fine, but we will have to modify arrangements at Bocketts Farm with particular reference to the distancing of groups to keep within the guideline numbers at the registration points.



By now you should have received an email or letter explaining how the registration procedure will operate. This document will contain two important sections: the first section has all the usual motoring indemnity details that you have signed in past years, but it will also contain a section relating to all the COVID precautions that we are all used to by now and which will apply during this event. Please ensure that you read this prior to arriving on the morning of 18th July to sign in. You will also be given a half hour band of arrival time at Bocketts Farm, which is important. The second section will contain a tear off area to be displayed in your windscreen on arrival at Bocketts Farm indicating your unique entry number and the colour of your registration point (RED, GREEN, BLUE or WHITE GAZEBO). These plans will assist our marshals to guide you efficiently on the day.

Foggy has, once again, planned a picturesque route of about 62 miles to Leonardslee which should take you about 2½ hours. Once you have registered and made yourselves comfortable, we ask that you leave promptly in order to limit congestion for others following in the next time slot.

We have been planning this event for almost two years and I would like to thank you all for your support and understanding during these difficult times. I look forward to life returning to something near normal in the not too far distant future. In the mean time I am sure that we will have a great day on the 18th July.

CORDLES' RUN

On Sunday 22nd August our annual event will be leading you through the lanes of Surrey and Sussex. We will start from The Pheasant, Reigate Rd, Betchworth RH3 7BG and end up at Highdown Chalk Gardens near Worthing. We visited these gardens in 2010, but unfortunately the weather was very poor, and we ended up picnicking under umbrellas.

There will be our regular fun quiz for you to complete en-route, if you so wish. On arrival there is a large grass overflow car park where we can have our traditional picnic, with views across the countryside towards Worthing and the channel. For the more energetic there is a lovely walk up to the Top of Highdown Hill, via the Millers Tomb, and the earthwork remains of a roman fort.



The 8.5 acres of Gardens were created out of an old chalk pit overlooking the South Downs, where there was little soil and very unfavourable conditions for plant growth. The Chalk Garden at Highdown is the achievement of Sir Frederick and Lady Stern who worked for 50 years to prove that plants would grow on chalk. This was during a period when many expeditions were going out to China and the Himalayan regions collecting rare and beautiful plants. Many of the original plants from the early collections can still be seen in the Gardens today, particularly plants collected by two pioneering botanists Reginald Farrer and Ernest Henry Wilson. The gardens were closed for 18 months to enable an extensive million pound project improving the gardens, walkways and visitors centre, and only reopened in May.

We are hopeful that the gardens will be fully opened by this date without any restrictions or requirement to book places, but even if there is limited access, subject to government advice we will still hold the run, as the facilities, tea rooms and picnic area are all outside the gardens.

There is no charge to enter the gardens, although they do greatly appreciate any donations you wish to make towards the upkeep

The starting point of the run is again at The Pheasant on the Reigate Road (A25) at Betchworth. Toilets, coffee and refreshments are available at the pub. We hope you will be able to join us. Cars will be leaving Reigate from 9.30 am onwards.
