Welcome to the first report for 2023. I am sure some members may have gone to Brooklands on 1st January for their Classic Car Day. Many of the dates for MG Events have now come out in various magazines and websites so do remember to keep yourselves up to date with these in the months ahead.

Please note that we are limited to 40 places at the Lamb and, to date, I have 22 people signed up for the Run and lunch. We shall give priority to those doing the Run when booking the lunches at The Lamb.

In February there is the MG and Triumph Spares Day at Stoneleigh Agricultural Centre in the Midlands, on Sunday 12th - this is a return to the normal venue, which makes it easier for those in the South of England. On 19th February we will be holding our Hunt the Valentine run which will commence from The Pheasant at Buckland RH3 7BG at 10am and end at The Plough at Leigh RH2 8NJ. There will be a pleasant drive in the countryside with the opportunity to look out for answers to clues on the way. Full details will be available in the February Newsletter. We have invited a limited number of cars from the MG Car Club SE Centre to join us on this event. Later in the month the London Classic Car Show will be at Olympia on the Weekend of 24th-26th February and tickets are available for this event.

SURREY RUN 2023

We are pleased to say that the final plans for our SURREY RUN, which is taking place on Sunday 16th July are now in place. The finishing point will be at Chiddingstone Castle, Edenbridge in Kent. This is a venue that some may remember as we have visited there just once before in 2018.

Chiddingstone was the home of an interesting gentleman called Denys Eyre Bower who used the castle to display a vast range of artifacts that he had collected over many years. He had a very colourful life including a prison sentence and finally going bankrupt. Bower left the castle and his collection to the nation and, upon his death, a Trust was formed to continue to care for the castle and its collection while opening it to the public. I will tell you more about this story in future articles.



Following some very productive meetings, the price of our all-inclusive run package including entry to the castle for driver and passenger will be £22.

Although we change the finish venue of the Run in order to give an element of variety each year, we always start at Bocketts Farm near Leatherhead. As you may know, this arrangement is very convenient because Bocketts provide all the essential facilities that we require such as ample parking space, loos and the vital breakfast = these will remain in place for 2023.
