As members probably know, the ULEZ is due to be expanded to all London Boroughs in August but vehicles with an historic taxation class are exempt from paying the charge of £12-50 per day.

If your vehicle was built more than 40 years ago, you can apply to the DVLA for Historic Taxation Class. <u>Click here</u> for the DVLA's website. Once you have the Historic Taxation class confirmed you will then need to register your vehicle with Transport for London, Kim has detailed the process in her Editors Etchings in this newsletter.

# **SURREY RUN 2023**

We are still making progress with our Surrey Run event, due to take place on the 16<sup>th</sup> July this year where the finishing venue is Chiddingstone Castle near Edenbridge in Kent. At present, we have a steady flow of applicants already registering to take part, which is encouraging.

Last month, I mentioned some facts about the history of the village of Chiddingstone and the strong links the area had during the reign of the Tudors. The origins of the castle date back to these early times when it was known as "High Street House" with Chiddingstone village high street running straight past it. During the 1700s, the early building was remodelled in the fashionable



style of the time as a medieval castle. The building has had a number of different occupants since including Lord Astor of Hever. It was also used as a military base during the last world war and then as a school.

The castle was put up for sale again in the 1950s and was bought by its last permanent occupant, Denys Eyre Bower, for the sum of six thousand pounds with a bank loan. Denys was never a wealthy man, starting his career as a bank clerk. In his forties he decided to follow his true passion for art and collecting by opening an antiques shop in London. It is a well-known fact that we all seem to like collecting things, but Denys Bower took this to another level. He actually bought the castle just to house his vast range of artifacts. He struggled with finances and opened the castle up for visitors to view his collections for a small fee. His fortunes took an even worse turn when he went bankrupt and decided to fake the death of his mistress in order to claim the insurance money. Unfortunately, he did mistakenly shoot her and then failed to commit his own suicide. This all finished with a spell in Wormwood Scrubs prison, after which he lived in the castle until his death in 1977. Chiddingstone Castle is presently managed by a trust, with funds raised by the monies received from fee-paying public visitors. Fortunately, this has preserved its history and the rooms, with many of the artifacts, will be on display during our visit.


