SURREY RUN 2022

With just a few weeks to go, I thought that I would say a little more about the things you will see at the MILESTONES LIVING MUSEUM, our destination point for this year's SURREY RUN. The Museum was opened in 2000 by the Duke of Edinburgh and has had the benefit of support from the Heritage Lottery Fund. In 2014 it transferred from County Council ownership to the Hampshire Cultural Trust.

The exhibits are designed to represent Victorian life in the local area. One specialty is the Thorneycroft Steam Wagon Company. This was based in Chiswick, but demand for their steam lorries and vans eventually led them, in 1898, to build a huge new factory in Basingstoke which also produced quality cars between 1903 to 1912. In its heyday it employed many thousands of people and some of the vehicles are on display in a building that also houses fascinating machinery from the original works.



You will also be able to admire beautifully restored vehicles such as trams, lorries and a Romany caravan to classic motorbikes and vehicles from the 1930s to 40s.

You can discover the authentic ticket office and railway based on the GWR Chesil Station in Winchester. In 1885 the GWR opened the Didcot, Newbury and Southampton railway line which initially terminated at Winchester station, until the line was extended to link with the Southern Railway to Southampton, it closed in 1966. You will also see the Woolmer steam locomotive built in 1910 that is on loan from the National Railway Museum.

While wandering through the Victorian streets you will come across the Beaverstock Arms Pub in Jubilee Street. At lunchtimes they serve teas, coffee and soft drinks as well as local ales. Occasionally there is even a pianist tinkling the ivories.

While roaming the historic streets and shops, you will also see collections of things that we had around the house in the past. These range from toys to vacuum cleaners, food mixers to radios and much more. There are room sets from different decades that will get you reminiscing about how we used to live.

I am sure that if you join us, you will have a great day out. Again this month I have added a booking form at the end of this article for both our regular participants and those new to Club events.


