SURREY RUN 2023

I must first thank everyone who not only helped with the organising but also those members who joined all the other MG enthusiasts taking part in our Surrey Run 2023. The high level of support from our Epsom membership has enabled us to continue with this event for so many years. Planning does take almost a year with the first consideration being the negotiation of a suitable end venue. With this established, the route is always the next important element. Our very own Routemaster, John Brooke, always takes this very seriously with repeated checks and a final test run a day or so before the event. You have heard that famous comment, "We have a problem Houston". You can imagine how my heart dropped when John phoned me to say, "We have a problem Nigel". It seemed that Thames Water had decided to undertake road works and close part of our route leaving us with only hours to find an alternative. By 8am on Sunday morning John had produced an amendment sheet that our efficient team dealing with the registrations explained to each participant. Kevin always conducts a final test before anyone starts their journey from Bocketts Farm on the day. To my great relief he reported back that our changes had all worked.



The sky was blue and, with the sun shining, the weather was predicted to be good for the rest of the day. By about 8.30 the start banner had been assembled, gazebos erected and, with a total of over 170 cars preregistered, we were ready to start proceedings. At exactly 8.45 we were contacted by BBC Sussex and Surrey as they had requested a live radio interview as part of their Sunday Breakfast Show. If anyone is interested, this can be repeated on BBC Sounds. As the cars left by passing under our start banner, the moment was captured by Kim who was ready to photograph each car as it set off. By about 11am most of the cars had left Bocketts Farm to negotiate the slight change in route directions and take advantage of a 60-mile drive through the picturesque countryside of Surrey and Sussex, finishing at Chiddingstone Castle in Kent. On arrival Ray, Joyce and their team had set up the welcoming arrangements with dedicated MG parking on the lawn in front of the castle. The cars started pouring in with the usual wide range of models ranging from early T Types to the latest examples. The most popular is always the MGB with 84 cars entering this year. This was followed in numbers by over 40 modern MGFs and TFs. I was pleased to meet with Harald and his wife Elisabeth Heinrici who were on holiday from Germany travelling in their MGB. As members of MGOC, they had seen our adverts for the Surrey Run in Enjoying MG. Realising that the date coincided with their holiday they booked online and joined us for the day.

We had a warm welcome from Rachel Lloyd the Events Manager at the castle and her colleague Donna who we met on our last visit in 2018. They were pleased with the number of cars on display, especially as it exceeded the 150 that I had estimated. The Surrey Run entry fee included admission to the castle and the visitors took a great interest in the wide range of artefacts on display. According to Dawn, the Catering Manager, there was also a great deal of activity in the café with significant sales including our popular favourite, the afternoon cream tea.

At the start of the Run, each driver was given a prize draw ticket containing their unique entry number to be handed in as they passed the finishing post. When everyone had arrived Rachel representing the management at the castle conducted the Prize Draw. First prize was won by Michael Mullins, entry number 103 winning a voucher for £25. Roger Boys, entry number 77 won second prize, a voucher for £15, and Christopher Godden-Miller, entry number 51, won third prize, a voucher for £10.



Once again, we have received many favourable comments. There will be a full report with many photos in the Owners' Club magazine due to be published in September. We would like to thank the Owners' Club at HQ for their continued support, the managements of both Bocketts Farm and Chiddingstone Castle for providing the start and end points of the route. We are grateful to all our friends and MG enthusiasts for their interest and involvement with the Epsom Area. I do hope that you all enjoyed the day. I will soon start thinking about Surrey Run 2024.

CORDLES' RUN

Sunday 20th August

On Sunday 20th August our annual Cordles' Run will be leading you through the lanes of Surrey and Sussex from The Pheasant at Buckland to Denmans Garden near Fontwell in Sussex. The route is slightly over 50 miles, so we have made a few changes which we hope will prove popular. As everyone knows the roads south of The Pheasant so well, this year the first part of the run will have no clues, and will be on good roads, although mainly missing any A roads. This will allow a pleasant drive on decent roads until you get south of Horsham. Then our normal questions will be provided for those that wish to partake. This will also allow a bit more time at Denmans, as the gardens close at 4pm.



Belonging, at the beginning of the 1900s, to Lord Denman, Denmans Garden reflects the horticultural history of Britain in the 20th century. Lord Denman sold the estate before World War I and it changed hands several times in the early part of the 20th century. The garden and its manor house were requisitioned by the WRAF during World War II. After the War the house was sold off and the garden was transformed from a neglected mess into a productive market garden. The contemporary 4-acre garden was converted from market garden to ornamental garden by plants woman Joyce Robinson who started the gravel gardens in 1970. It ended the century as a contemporary garden designed by its then-owner, John Brookes MBE. It remains a timeless, tranquil garden featuring a broad variety of interesting and unusual plants that are creatively and brilliantly combined with shingle paths, water features, faux dry riverbeds, a walled garden, conservatories, and wandering paths dotted with benches and statuary.

On arrival, follow the signs into the gardens and drive straight through the public car park and, at the far end go through a gate into the field at the rear. There is ample parking for us to park together and set up a display.

The Midpines cafe is located at the entrance, for meals, snacks or drinks. The restaurant, toilets and a small shop are located in the entrance and accessible without paying for entry into the gardens. Please note, as the gardens closes at 4pm, the cafe stops serving at 3.30pm



Admission to the Garden is £9 per adult and £7 for seniors.

Gardeners World 2for1 admission is £9 per couple. Cards are required. The discount cards are still available online, but with added postage the cost is £10 so only beneficial if you plan to visit other gardens in the scheme. There is more information at gardenersworld.com/2-for-1-gardens

Please note the starting place of the run this year is again at The Pheasant PH on the Reigate Road (A25) at Buckland. Toilets, coffee and light refreshments are available at the pub. We hope you will be able to join us. **The Pheasant doesn't open until 10am**, with cars leaving from 10.30am onwards.

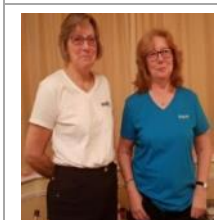
