

SURREY RUN 2023

We are now at the beginning of July with just a few days to go before our Surrey Run event, due to take place on the 16th, where the final destination is Chiddingstone Castle near Edenbridge in Kent. As you are all aware, the price of our Run also

In order to seal this rather attractive deal, we do guarantee a minimum of at least 150 cars and pay the total entry sum up front prior to the event. I am very pleased, and somewhat relieved, to let you all know that we have passed this magic number of entries. Malcolm Childs and I have also tested the route that Foggy has devised for this year. As the navigator, I generally avoid studying this in detail prior to setting off, on the basis that our participants will also have only seen the route an hour before starting their journey. 
