#### ULEZ

As you will know, the extended ULEZ came into force on 29<sup>th</sup> August. Don't forget that to be exempt, a vehicle over 40 years old must have Historic Vehicle Taxation class. You need to do this via the DVLA.

Further, to make sure that your vehicle is being recognised as ULEZ exempt, you need to set up an account with TFL Autopay. Using the initial checking link on the TFL website may not show your vehicle as being ULEZ exempt.
