I have received further updates about the Centenary End of Year event on the weekend of 18th -19th May. This is a joint venture between The SE MG Car Club, National MG Car Club, MG Owners Club Headquarters and SE Area MGOC Clubs with a series of MG runs on the Saturday, to The Fairmile KT11 1BW at Cobham, with evening buffet and Brooklands display of MGs on the Sunday. There will be at least 5 runs from Aylesford, Kent; East Grinstead; Kingsfold (near Horsham); Ashington, Sussex and Alresford, Hampshire. These will leave around 10.30 to11am and arrive at The Fairmile at Cobham around 2.30pm. Members will be able to go to The Fairmile direct for the afternoon show and early evening buffet. Costs are likely to be £15 for the runs and £20 for the buffet. There will be a £5 charge for those going direct to the Fairmile. SURREY RUN 2024

As some of you already know, this year's Surrey Run will again visit the Rural Life Living Museum in Farnham on Sunday July 14th. As usual, the start will be at Bocketts Farm. The scenic route will cover a distance of about 60 miles. On arrival, you and your MG will be received by our marshals and provided with special MG parking.





The run costs only £24 includes a free rally plate, route instructions and entry into the prize draw for those who complete the run. The fee also includes free entry for the driver and passenger to the Rural Life Living Museum, which is an open-air museum, set in over 10 acres of open space and woodland with an arboretum containing over 100 trees. There

are places to shelter if it rains, a picnic area for lunch, and secluded benches to take a break. The Market Garden Café serves a variety of hot and cold food and there is always tea and cake to finish off a great day out!
