SECRETARY'S SCRIBBLINGS

April is with us. As the clocks change, and the evenings are lighter, we have the hope of some better weather and opportunities to get our cars out. At least it will make it easier to spot the potholes!

If you are driving into Sutton to attend a club night or show, or for any other reason, please be aware of the changes in the speed limits. They appear very confusing, as the speed limit on a lot of the main roads is now slower than many residential roads. Keep your eyes open for speed limits painted on the road as well as signs. I can't list them all, but the main road from Cheam to Croydon, via Sutton (A232) is all 20mph. The Sutton by-pass (A217) is 40mph, but shortly before the Cheam crossroads it suddenly drops to 30mph by the railway bridge, and remains at this speed until Abbotts Road, which is near The Gander crossroads.

Have you found, when driving in the dark, that you are regularly blinded by the headlights from oncoming traffic? Have you then thought it's probably because of your age and your eyesight? The RAC have been doing a lot of research into this issue, which can be very dangerous for all road users. Their research amongst motorists found that the vast majority are unhappy with the increased brightness of car headlights. Many believe they are dangerous and likely to increase the risk of an accident as a driver dazzled by bright lights could be briefly unable to see. The RAC, as a result of their research, are calling on the Government to commission an independent study into the issue of headlight glare. A sobering thought, if you are blinded by oncoming light for one second, at 30mph you will have covered over 40 feet.

The Cordles' Run on 18th August will be going from The Pheasant at Buckland to the Wings Museum near Balcombe in West Sussex. We have paid them a visit and they have offered us a nice grassy spot for us to park and display our cars and have a picnic. The Run will follow the normal format but be a lot shorter than last year, with the normal simple questions for those who want to partake. March was a quiet month, with the Club having no shows to attend, however the Auction Night was well attended. There was also a very successful Skittles Night and Nige T arranged a couple of natters and a coffee morning which many members attended.
