Dear All

Not a great deal going on club-wise last month, with no shows to attend but we started April with an excellent club night with the Police in attendance talking about online fraud. We also had the very sad news this month that a long-time member Ray Reeves had lost his battle with the cancer he had been bravely battling for years. Ray has always been a larger-than-life figure at the club, always willing to help and with a smile on his face. He will be sadly missed by us all. Our thoughts are with Joyce and his family.

If April was quiet, May is going to be extremely busy. Club night starts the month on the 2nd with live musical entertainment from the Funky Fiddler, something I am looking forward to, and I think a first for a club night.

The following day, thirty plus members are off to the Forest of Dean for four days on our club weekend. These are always great fun, and one of the additional options is a trip in the Dean Forest Railway.

There is a lunchtime natter on the 16th and the 18th-19th May will see a large attendance at Brooklands for the MG100 event. Although not an Epsom MG event a lot of our members will be attending with several helping on the site.

On Tuesday 21st, members are having a guided tour around Charterhouse in London. Add a probable coffee morning to the events and May is indeed busy.

We also find out in May, after the elections, whether Mayor Khan will be re-elected. Although it looks most likely he will, his main opponent has said if she gets elected the ULEZ extension will be cancelled on her first day in office. There is also an interesting article in the latest issue of 'Historic', the magazine of the FBHVC, that suggests counties throughout the country are looking at charging parking fees in relation to how 'clean' the cars are. Reading the article, it appears they believe this is something that will happen and probably sooner rather than later.

I have been attempting to do a few jobs on the B before we go to the Forest of Dean and, as is so often the case, simple jobs get complicated. Movement on the sunroof handle turned out not to be loose screws, but the pop rivets coming loose, so they had to be drilled out and new rivets put in. Repairing the windscreen washer jets, that had been sprayed with paint when the car was resprayed, turned into a nightmare as getting a hand behind the dashboard to put new piping through appeared almost impossible. Finally, trying to fix issues with my headlights went from replacing a defective side light to a complete replacement of both headlight units. I originally bought new Tudor lenses, but when it arrived the sidelight fitting was different to the B but came with an extra cable you can cut and fit, but that meant cutting and joining the new wire, something I don't like to do as it is a weakness for future years, so I ended up buying complete new headlights for both sides. Hopefully we get to the Forest of Dean in the B, because last year we got halfway to Warwick and had to turn back due to a problem with the prop shaft.

SURREY RUN

RAY REEVES



I had already written the Surrey Run article for this month when we heard the very sad news that Ray Reeves had passed away. Both Sue and I were so devastated that I decided to tear up the old article and start again.

I have so many memories of Ray that I felt I would share some thoughts with you all. We always knew when we were in Ray's presence because he was generally at the centre of things. His light-hearted banter and jovial attitude made him a very popular Club member. Ray and Joyce attended many Club activities, often travelling long distances in their MGB and he always had some tale to tell on their return.

I remember way back in the mid-1990s when I foolishly volunteered to take responsibility running the Southern National MG event at Leatherhead. This was a heavy undertaking involving every member of our Epsom Area, but who was in the thick of it, none other than our Ray Reeves. We basically took over all the grounds at the Leatherhead Leisure Centre with some of us, including Ray and Joyce camping by the river. This was a very tranquil scene but despite dedicating significant time in helping us, I was intrigued to hear him on the phone still running his business from his tent.

The Surrey Run was always a small part of this National Show, but in 2001 we decided to form it as a main independent event. Ray immediately offered to take the lead in organising the marshals at our final destination each year. He always enjoyed the venues and during the month of July we were blessed with good weather. I do however remember a couple of occasions when this was not the case. The first one was Painshill Park in Cobham, a very large and beautiful landscaped garden but with no cover if it rained, and my word how it did. The second was at the Weald and Downland Museum in Sussex. On all our planning visits we saw a range of historic buildings in a beautiful setting, but on the day of the Run you could not see your hand in front of your face. Ray was never phased by this and with his typical optimism, his next question would be, "Where are we going next year". Even though we have used some sites more than once, Ray would always insist on a revisit, making himself known to the management, demonstrating his professionalism and attention to detail. I am convinced that it is this attitude that has helped maintain our reputation and made this event so popular.

For some while many of us have been aware of Ray's health issues. When I have enquired, he generally answered with a jovial quip and then to my surprise insisted on continuing his role. At the beginning of this year, however, he did contact me to apologise (typical Ray) for stepping down. We had a long chat reminiscing about the highlights of our adventures, included the rain. I cannot express the gratitude that I have personally for the friendship, support and confidence that Ray has given me for nearly thirty years. His significant contribution has helped us raise many tens of thousands of pounds, making a difference to a number of deserving causes.

Ray will be missed by all his friends at Epsom and our thoughts are with Joyce and her family at this very sad time.
