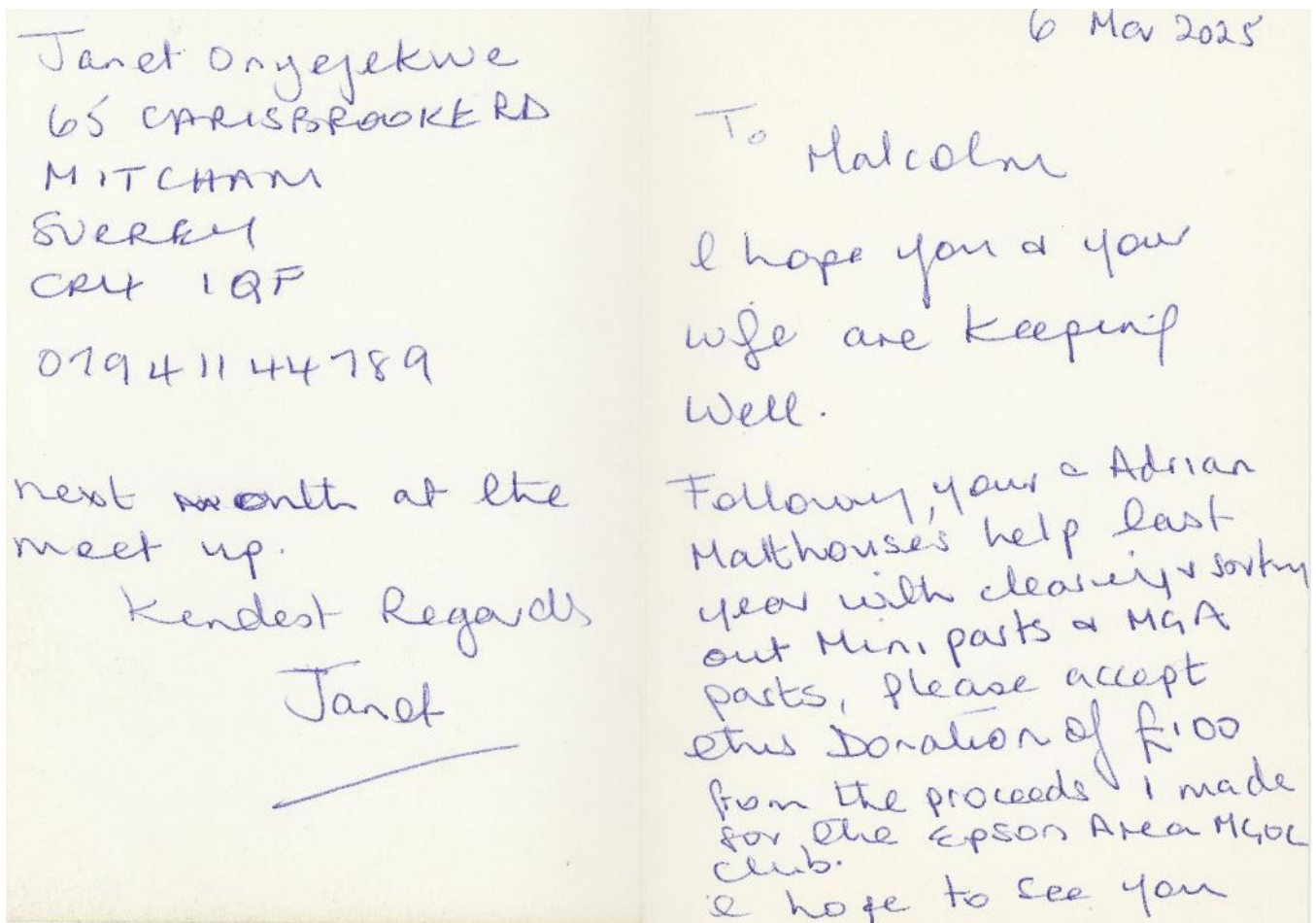

# SURREY RUN 2025

As you are all aware, our Surrey Run is due to take place on the 13th July and we are finishing at the Gatwick Aviation Museum. There you will not only see a private collection of aircraft but also displays related to the adjacent airport that has a very interesting history. Traces of this go back to the 1920s when an area between Gatwick Racec

ourse and Lowfield Heath in the parish of Charlwood was acquired to establish the Surrey Aero Club, a small flyers club for enthusiasts. In 1934 a public aerodrome licence was granted allowing the first scheduled flights to Paris. A year later in 1935 the railway station (initially Tinsley Green, later Gatwick Airport) was opened and connected to the first airport terminal called "The Beehive". (See photo).



During the war Gatwick was requisitioned by the RAF and used as a base. In 1952 the government decided to develop Gatwick as London's second airport. Major development took place between 1956 and 1958 when the new Gatwick was officially opened by the Queen featuring a new terminal now called the South Terminal. The North Terminal; was added in the 1980s along with a new control tower.

Gatwick has grown into a major international airport, handling many millions of passengers annually and managing about 900 aircraft movements each day. Being so close, the Aviation Museum has its own dedicated observation area where during our visit we will be able to appreciate firsthand the high level of airport activity constantly taking place. You will be able to find out much more information during our visit and I am sure we will have a most interesting day.

# OBITUARY

## ALEC ADAMS

It was with much sadness that I received the news that Alec Adams had passed away on the 9th of April, aged 91 after a long period of ill health.

Alec and Sue became members of the Epsom Area MGOC in March 1993. Following his retirement from work, initially he did not own an MG, so treated himself to a 1500 MG Midget. Alec soon became involved in all the club activities, particularly those supporting charities and car displays which helped raise funds for local deserving causes. They also enjoyed the short weekend breaks to the Isle of Wight in a caravan and at Warners Holiday Camp.

Over a number of years, we organised the MG Southern National Event at Leatherhead, which provided camping facilities, car parking, trade stands, MG competition. A major element was marking out the boundaries of the site with a white line marking machine. Once this was completed, Alec had more white mixture on him than there was on the field!

Alec made many friends in the club and, although he traded his MG Midget for a Mazda MX5 as it was more comfortable for him to drive, this did not stop him continuing to give his support to all our fundraising charity events such as The Children's Trust and Saint Raphael's Hospice. He also had a hobby sailing his own boat and, due to his ill health missed this year's Dinner Dance and Annual Awards for the first time.

Alec will be greatly missed, and we are the poorer for his passing. We send our deepest sympathy to Sue, Paul, family and friends for their sad loss and hope that the many fond memories they have of their life together will ease the pain of his passing.
