Well, here we are with just a few days to go before our biggest special event of the year, the "Surrey Run 2025" taking place on Sunday 13th July. I thought that I would give you the last update on progress before we go into action.

Final meetings have taken place with both the start and end venue hosts. John "Foggy" Brooke, our very own Route Master had given us the go ahead and declared that he is happy with his route design from Bocketts Farm to the Gatwick Aviation Museum. We have tested our picturesque country route taking about two hours to complete and declared that once again John has done an excellent job. On this basis, the rally plates and route maps have now all gone to print. As usual Kevin will be the first away at about 8am on the morning for a final check. The route includes a selection of pubs and garden centres on the way for those requiring a lunch stop. On arrival at Gatwick you will be greeted by our marshals. Do not forget to hand in your special Prize Draw ticket as you reach the finish line for inclusion in the Draw that may win you store vouchers worth a total of £50.

Most participants take a picnic lunch that can be enjoyed in the huge field that we have been allocated for parking very close to the museum building. There is also a snack bar on site with a range of teas, coffee, ices, sandwiches and cream teas for

those wishing to partake during the afternoon. I am also informed that there may be special tours that you can book of the huge war time Shackleton Bomber that you will notice parked outside the main hanger and in dire need of some care and attention. For those interested, they do make a charge of £5 per person for this tour which goes towards the restoration fund. During the afternoon we will also have the pleasure of listening to a range of music from the 1930s onwards, sung by The Angel Delights, a close harmony vintage trio based in West Sussex. Brought together through their love of singing in harmony, they found each other in a local competition choir.
