Our annual Surrey Run charity event rolled out in style on Sunday, 13th July, and what a scorcher it was! Starting from the ever-welcoming Bocketts Farm Park near Leatherhead, our route was designed to meander through the beautiful leafy lanes and charming villages of Surrey, finishing at the historic Gatwick Aviation Museum in Charlwood.

Spirits were high at Bocketts and with over 160 MGs prebooked we were on site ready to set up by 8am. By 8.30 the cars started to arrive including one containing our youngest participant wearing his MG hat. Everyone signed in under the glorious sunshine and our marshals were kept busy organising the parking of an amazing gathering of gleaming cars. In the lineup were a number of current models together with early T-types, MGAs, Midgets and a



Magnette. With over 80 MGBs and variants, these are still the most popular entrants with the second being the MGFs and TFs. An eye-catching red MG Cyberster, driven by Michael Earle, with its futuristic gullwing doors, certainly turned heads. This is the present flagship model in the MG range and proved that the MG spirit is alive and well into the 21st century.






On arrival at the Gatwick Aviation Museum, drivers were welcomed by our second cheerful team of marshals where all the cars were parked forming an impressive display for other visitors to admire. Quite soon everyone started arranging their tables and chairs in preparation for a relaxing picnic lunch. The museum offered a treasure trove of aviation history, including a peek inside a first-class Virgin Atlantic cabin. Visitors explored a number of iconic British aircraft and hundreds of model displays. They could venture into the cockpit of an Islander aircraft and climb inside a Canberra nose section. They even took a tour aboard the Avro Shackleton parked outside near the MGs. During the afternoon we were entertained by a trio called The Angel

Delights, whose wartime songs brought a nostalgic touch to our visit. Many also strolled in the 30-acre grounds and enjoyed views of Gatwick's active runway from the observation area.

At the start of the run each driver was given a prize draw ticket containing their unique run number to be handed in as they passed the finish line. When everyone had arrived, Karen Tibbs, representing the Gatwick Aviation Museum announced a selection of winners. Three tickets were randomly chosen as follows; Entry number 47, Stuart Gendall who won first prize, a store voucher for £25. Entry number 57, David Farncombe won second prize, a voucher for £15, and Entry number 108, Martin Bond won third prize, a voucher for £10.

CORDLES' RUN TO RAMSTER GARDENS SUNDAY 17TH AUGUST

The Cordles' Run this year will take place on Sunday 17th August, starting at our normal place, The Pheasant at Buckland RH3 7BG and ending at Ramster Gardens Petworth Road, Chiddingfold GU8 4SN. We will try to find the prettiest route we can keeping off the main roads as much as possible and should cover around 40 miles.

On arriving at the gardens please follow the instructions that will lead you through the gravel car park to a grassed area at the rear where we will all be able to park together and make a display. This grassed area is classed as their picnic area, so anyone wishing to partake of the traditional picnic amongst the cars is welcome to do so. There is a cafe about 100 yards from where we park for those who want coffee and cakes as well as toilet facilities.

As in previous years we will be doing our normal fun quiz enroute. Most of these are simple places or things to spot but look out for the odd 'sneaky' question. If you don't wish to do the quiz you are still very welcome to just do the run.





Ramster is a stunning woodland garden of over 25 acres renowned for its captivating beauty and tranquillity. Ramster Hall and Garden's history goes back to the 17th century. Rams Nest, as it was then called, continued a peaceful farming existence with the house being variously modernised and updated over the centuries. In 1900 it was bought by Sir Harry Waechter who converted the

farmhouse into an Edwardian country house. In 1922 the house was purchased by Sir Henry Norman, and the house still belongs to the same family. The

gardens first opened to the public in 1927 as part of the National Garden Scheme. 97 years on, the family is still open for this special day but also shares their much-loved garden, which is now famous for its different varieties of rhododendrons, with visitors during spring, summer, and autumn. Explore the natural winding paths at Ramster Gardens, whose features include a wooded area and water features. Find out more about Ramster here.
