# Christmas Decorations – How Long Are Yours Up For? By Kev Watson

According to modern tradition, most people would consider putting up their Christmas decorations around the beginning of December and taking them down on Twelfth Night in January. However, there are some that believe festive adornments should be erected for the duration of the traditional medieval mid-winter festivities, which starts sooner and finishes later.

#### Modern dates for putting up decorations:

- Advent Sunday: This is the traditional start date for many, marking the beginning of the liturgical Christmas season. It is always the fourth Sunday before Christmas (which falls between November 27 December 3).
- Late November/Early December: Many families and communities start decorating during this period, sometimes right after American Thanksgiving (4<sup>th</sup> Thursday in November (23<sup>rd</sup> 29<sup>th</sup>)), or as soon as December 1st arrives.
- Mid-November: Some places, like certain London streets, have their Christmas lights switched on and decorations up in early November.

#### Modern dates for taking down decorations:

- New Year's Day: Many people take down decorations after New Year's Day to signal the start of a fresh New Year.
- Twelfth Night (January 5<sup>th</sup>): The Eve of The Feast of Epiphany; this is a traditional date, marking the end of the 12 days of Christmas, according to many Christian traditions.

#### Medieval dates for putting up decorations:

• Martinmas: St. Martin's Day falls on November 11<sup>th</sup>, and, during the Middle Ages, coincided with the gathering of the harvest. It was also the start of feasting to celebrate the end of autumn, and the start of preparations for winter. Jams and dried fruits, along with preserves and pickles, were prepared so as to last throughout the season. Dwellings were also decorated with holly, mistletoe and evergreens as part of the celebrations. Advent used to be a seven-week period (like Easter's Lent) and known as St. Martin's Lent.


#### Medieval dates for taking down decorations:

- Candlemas (February 2<sup>nd</sup>): Is the 40<sup>th</sup> day after Christmas (the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary) and marks the official end of the Christmas-Epiphany season for some denominations and is seen by some as the last day to keep decorations up. The date itself was a great feast day and is so called because candles to be used in churches through the coming year would be blessed on that day. There were also candlelit processions honouring the feast.
- Leaving decorations up beyond Candlemas is considered inauspicious by some.

So, depending on which camp you fall into, you are likely to be either a modern follower, and have your decorations up from early December until January 5<sup>th</sup> (around 25 days), or a traditionalist, having your decorations up from as early as Martinmas on November 11<sup>th</sup> all the way to Candlemas on February 2<sup>nd</sup> (a full 84 days). This will also depend on your personal religious observances.
