SURREY RUN

This month I thought that I would say a little more about the collection of artifacts at Hollycombe Steam Museum. I have previously mentioned that, in 1951, the estate was purchased by the late Commander John Baldock who from an early age had developed a love of steam power. During your visit as part of the Surrey RUN on 19th July, you will see his collection that also includes examples of working steam driven farm equipment.

In the 1800s steam engines revolutionised farming by replacing horses and manual labour with mechanical power. This reduced labour costs and drastically increased efficiency. Initially, in the 1790s, stationary engines were used for threshing and by the 1830s they had evolved into portable engines. These then developed into large self-propelled traction engines by the 1850s and could be used for other tasks powering ploughing and hauling. The stationary engines were originally used in threshing by replacing time-consuming hand-flailing, drastically speeding up the separation of grain from chaff. Portable engines were also towed by horses between farms to power other machinery. By the 1850s, massive traction engines sometimes worked in pairs using cable systems. Between them, these could pull large multi-furrow ploughs, improving productivity on large fields. Steam power significantly lowered the reliance on horses and human labour for heavy tasks. This often alleviated labour shortages in many areas. The superior power of steam allowed for deeper ploughing and the ability to cultivate larger areas of land. Steam engines however were expensive, often limiting their ownership to larger farms. They required skilled operators and consumed large quantities of coal, wood and constant water supplies. This situation finally led to the later adaption of the internal combustion tractors that were produced in millions.



Fortunately, John Baldock had the foresight to preserve some of this early equipment, saving it for us to still admire in this present age of modern farming technology.

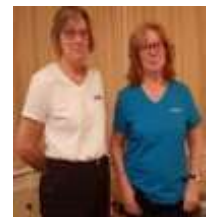
