SURREY RUN REPORT

Following an extended period of hot dry weather and a long-range forecast predicting rain on the day of our 2026 Surrey Run, I was relieved to wake up on Sunday 19th July to a glorious sunny day. On arrival at Bocketts Farm, I was pleased to see Paul Coleman with Michael and Jamie, his usual team of helpers, already assembling the start gate in preparation for the photo scene. As you know, for some while Paul and Rita have had a very difficult time that has concerned us all regarding Rita's health issues and her recovery may take some while.

Rapid progress was made with the gazebos for booking in. All the appropriate spreadsheets were in place ready to receive the participants taking part in the event. This year seemed to be as popular as ever with many prebooked and a number turning up on the day giving a total of



about 185 cars registering an interest, more than I expected. We had a comfortable number of Marshals, and they were soon kept busy with parking as the cars started pouring in. For months I had seen numbers grow on a paper list, but it was a wonderful sight to see them for real, and it was our responsibility to provide them with an enjoyable and memorable day. Having checked in at the gazebos, glanced at the route instructions, attached the rally plates, visited the farm for a comfort break and possibly taken advantage of the famous bacon butty at the Barn Café, it was time to set off. Each participant set their milometer trip to zero for

the 55-mile picturesque journey to Hollycombe Steam Museum, our destination for this year.

On arrival the cars were met and parked by our Marshals based at Hollycombe, forming an impressive display for all to admire. There was the usual mix of most models but once again the MGB was still dominant with over 80 examples registered. The reception team checked each car in as it arrived and distributed the free ride tickets for the range of attractions to each participant. My observations indicated that the train ride with stunning views over the South Downs was the most popular. We were joined at Hollycombe by Jo Deal and Chris representing the Owners' Club. They had driven down from the MGOC Headquarters in Cambridge that morning and during the day were able to catch up with many other Club members. The day ended with a prize draw



being conducted by Jo from the MGOC and three lucky winners went home with gift vouchers. This year there was also a fourth prize drawn and donated by the Owners' Club that was won by our Chris Redhead.



From the lovely comments received, it's clear that everyone we spoke to had a wonderful time. This was also endorsed by the report from the Hollycombe Management of a high demand for cream teas, something we expected. During the last twenty-six years this was our 25th Anniversary Surrey Run, only missing 2020 during the Pandemic. A heartfelt thank you from me to all our volunteers and everyone who took part in this year's event. As I said, we had many very favourable comments. and I was very proud of you all.

CORDLES' RUN 2026



The Cordles' Run this year will take place on Sunday 23rd August, meeting as usual at The Pheasant, Reigate Rd, Betchworth RH3 7BG at 10am and ending at Riverhill Himalayan Gardens, Sevenoaks, Kent. The route is less than 40 miles, but as normal we have kept off the main roads as much as possible.

As in previous years we will be doing our fun quiz on route. Most of these are simple places or things to spot but look out for the odd sneaky question and there is one designated stop where you will find 5 questions. If you don't wish to do the quiz you are still very welcome to just do the run.

On arriving at the gardens please follow the instructions that will lead you up the hill through to the back of the car park where we will have a designated space. Anyone wishing to partake of the traditional picnic amongst the cars is welcome to do so but there is also an excellent cafe for lunch, coffee or cakes about 100yards from where we will park as well as toilet facilities. Dogs are welcome but must be on a lead in the gardens.

Riverhill is known for its beautiful and historic gardens, expansive views across the Weald of Kent and a warm and friendly welcome. Home to the Rogers family since 1840, these family run gardens offer visitors space to explore and admire. Riverhill have over 12 acres of historic gardens to explore, punctuated with contemporary sculpture, as well as woodland paths, breathtaking views and plenty of benches for quiet contemplative moments. Surrey Sculpture Society will again be displaying a selection of over 60 of their sculptures around the gardens. The gardens are on the side of a hill, but the area around the restaurant, shops, toilets etc and the formal and rose gardens are easily accessible.

The more energetic may care to follow the paths to the top of the hills to see the amazing views and try to find the route through the unique maze. The maze is based on Tibetan carvings and can be solved by going in either a clockwise or anticlockwise direction.

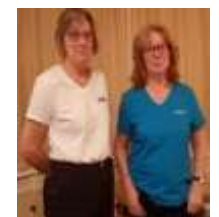
