MALCOLM KIMBERLEY

1933 – 2022

It is with much sadness that we received the news that Malcolm passed away in a care home on Thursday 28 July.

Malcolm and Beryl joined the Epsom Area MGOC in 1991 and were regular attendees at monthly meetings, car and social events. Malcolm served on the committee as Area Secretary for a number of years and organised several social events and made all the arrangements with the Kingswood Golf and Country Club, of which he was a member, for the successful Dinner Dance and Annual Awards. Malcolm was a generous individual and will be greatly missed by all those who knew him, and we are the poorer for his passing. We offer Beryl, his children Virginia, Steve, Donald and Richard our deepest sympathy on their sad loss.

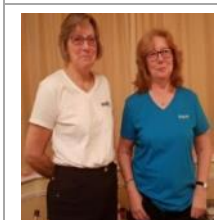
