Results will be in next month's newsletter.

The Winchester MGOC Cobweb Run is on Sunday 14th April and will be a meet-up at The Rural Life Museum nr. Farnham. I continue to receive further updates about the Centenary End of Year event on the weekend of 18-19th May. This is a joint venture between the SE MG Car Club, National MG Car Club, MG Owners Club Headquarters and SE Area MGOC Clubs with a series of MG runs on the Saturday to The Fairmile at Cobham KT11 1BW, with evening buffet then Brooklands display of MGs on the Sunday.

There will be 6 runs, at least, from Aylesford, West Malling and Edenbridge in Kent, East Grinstead, Kingsfold (nr. Horsham), Ashington, Sussex and Alresford, Hampshire. These will leave around 10.30-11.00am and arrive at The Fairmile at Cobham around 2.30pm. Members will be able to go to The Fairmile directly for the afternoon show and early evening buffet. Costs are likely to be £15 for the Runs and £18 for the buffet. There will be a £5 charge for those going direct to the Fairmile, but if you are having the buffet, you only pay the £18 per head. There will be parking for 170 Cars on the Saturday.

On the Sunday there will be a full MG Day at Brooklands with a Pride of Ownership, Competition Car Display, MG 100 Cavalcade, and various MG Car Club and MG Owners Club allocated parking together with trade and other stands and entertainment including famous MG Speakers. Admission will be £20 per person; however, Brooklands and London Bus Museum members will have free access.

Tickets for both of these days can be obtained at www.mgccse.co.uk/mg-south-east/. The Club has agreed to be involved in marshalling at both The Fairmile on Saturday afternoon and the Sunday at Brooklands. SURREY RUN 2024

As many of you probably know our 2024 Surrey Run event is due to take place on 14th July and will finish at the Rural Life Museum at Tilford near Farnham. The museum was originally founded by a couple called Madge and Henry Jackson. They both had country interests and following their marriage in 1948 they moved to a rather primitive cottage called the "Old Kiln". Although now modernised, it can still be seen adjacent to the museum grounds. In 1968 they unearthed an old horse drawn plough in some woods at Waterlooville in Hampshire. They then brought it home to use as a garden ornament. This is where the passion for collecting old artifacts started and in 1973 it first opened as the Old Kiln Agricultural Museum. Covering an area of over 10 acres of fields and woodlands, visitors can experience the social history of village life from the 19th century. There are displays of school life, domestic work, period shops and country trades.



Following the death of both Madge and Henry, the site is now run by the Old Kiln Museum Trust. Since our last visit the museum has received further funding and recently it was renamed the "Rural Life Living Museum". The vast collection now consists of over 40000 preserved artifacts all associated with farming and various goods used by local craftsmen between the years of 1750 and 1960. These exhibits can be seen in large barns together with over 30 buildings including a local country garage and post war Prefab. There is even a working iron furnace, a woodyard and an operational light railway, all run by local volunteers. There will be plenty for us to see during our visit and I am sure we will all have a great day. You can find more about the Rural Life Living Museum by [clicking here](#).
